"God has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing that comes from heaven. God chose us in Christ to be holy and blameless... God destined us to be adopted as children through Jesus Christ's love" (Ephesians 1:3-5a). God's graciousness always has two parts. The first part is wonderful: we are blessed, loved, and adopted as Christ's brothers and sisters. The second is part is daunting—there are expectations of us.

Held by God's embrace and forgiven by Christ's mercy, we are called to live transformed lives. We are called to be lights in the darkness, signs of what is right in a world pained with wrongs. We are called to be glue where there is brokenness and healing where there are wounded. We are called beyond random acts of kindness to go out of our way on purpose like a Good Samaritan wherever we see human need. Living a transformed life wasn't easy in in the first century for those who knew Jesus in the flesh. I doubt it will be easy in 2020. Weariness, anger, disappointment, and and how we can encourage and bless. Amen." compassion-fatigue are common-place among those who seek to serve others. Blessing people has always been like planting seeds and prayerfully waiting for results.

Part of the beauty of Paul's letter to the Ephesians is that he reminds them they are not alone. He reminds them he is praying for them. He reminds them God is still holding them close. Moreover, he reminds them they are a "THEM." They aren't alone. January 5th we'll have the chance to hear Ephesians 1:3-14 where Paul uses the pronouns "us", "we", "our", "you" and "your" (in their plural forms)

15 times. We are not alone as we seek to follow Christ.

"We Are not Alone" is our January theme. We'll explore how God can use us to encourage, sustain, and uplift each other as we seek to do the daunting stuff we are called to do as followers of Jesus. Turning the other cheek stings but it stings less if a friend is there to care for us afterwards. Praying for another who may be on a difficult path can be tiring but it's is easier if others also pray with us. Attempting to be faithful in a world that's changing in ways we don't understand can feel overwhelming but there is comfort in knowing others are seeking to be faithful with us.

We Are not Alone. Who do we know besides ourselves that might benefit most from being surrounded with caring encouragement? I invite us to hold that question in our hearts as we seek to be signs of Christ's love and light in the FM area. I invite us to pray together every day in January, "Loving God remind me I am not alone. Ever-present Christ, show us who


