

WHAT IS PRAYER?

Well, I'm curious? Last month I challenged you to think about your prayer life. Did you find your mind wondering when you said the Lord's Prayer, or any prayer? It is easy to get side-tracked, as memorized prayers can be said without thinking. That's like working on a project or meal while listening to your young children tell you about their pet monkey. When we pray we are expecting God to hear our prayer, and if it is part of HIS will, that He will grant us, or guide us to the answer of our request. We need to understand that our prayers must be sincere petitions, and that we are open for God's will. Let's get started on ways that should help us on our prayer journey:

- * Start out with addressing your prayers to God, Father, Jesus, or Lord. Ask Him to hear your prayer.
- * Ask for forgiveness of your sins, especially those for people you personally have not forgiven.
- * Give praise and honor to Him for your daily necessities, and for His guidance from evil and temptation.
- * Ask for what you seek and that it may be completed by His will, not yours.
- * Give praise and respect that God's Holy plan is better than yours, and that you trust God to provide what you need in the time He has planned.
- * Ask that the Holy Spirit speak clearly to you and direct you. Then open yourself up to that experience.
- * Seek wisdom to know what's right and wrong, and the strength to follow God.
- * Affirm your prayer that you trust God and KNOW that He will provide for you according to His plan.

Remember, God is not Santa Clause, or a place to get your wishes granted. The Trinity is your counselor, adviser, supporter, rock, and especially your friend. There are **Do Nots** with prayer:

- * Do Not expect God to immediately answer your prayers. God has plan for you. He <u>Does Not</u> wave a magic wand.
- * Do Not expect that you can avoid suffering along your life journey. We lost that at the beginning of man. Changing a health outcome may take longer than you hoped. If you are trusting God, you will be celebrating with each positive change and step until you are healed, or you have joined Him in Heaven.
- * Do Not bargain with God. Never say that you will come back to church, give up drinking, nor swear
- * anymore if He grants your prayer. God is not a used-car salesman
- * Do Not share long-winded, haughty prayers with fancy words thinking that the more you say the better the

- outcome. God wants you to speak from the heart. He knows what's in your heart.
- * Do Not lie to cover up transgressions. God knows all. Accept and take responsibility for your sins. Then ask for forgiveness, and work harder to correct your actions in the future. You will sin again, but hopefully you sin less each day until the day you die

hopefully, you sin less each day until the day you die. Most of us have realized that we can't do life on our own. If you are a believer, meaning you accept Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, and that He died on the cross, was buried, rose again three days later, and went back to heaven, I look forward to being with you in Heaven. I would have to write a novel to tell you how God has worked in my life to guide me to who and what I am today. Oh, I've messed up, been a disappointment, failed, but I know that my sins are forgiven. It's taken me longer than it should to realize how God has worked in my life and used me to serve Him. From nearly drowning at age 5, to surviving serious injuries when I was young, to guiding me when and how to serve as an adult. I've had a great life, but I don't need rewards or acknowledgments. I'm trying to do what God wants me to do. I'm anxiously waiting for that

> hug from Jesus when I enter Heaven. If my kids were making the decisions, I would be doing absolutely nothing. I'd give-up the things God has called me to do, rather than listening to HIS call and directions. God told me it was time to step back from my leadership roles in church and the community. I did just that. My Godly focus is now on my writing, especially for caregivers in my online group, and those who seek me out asking for help. I will continue my monthly newsletter articles as long as God guides me in what to write. There is absolutely no doubt in my mind, that the most important gift I received, is how God guided me to my wife Luann. We have been married for 53 years. Luann thinks it's more like 106 years. There have been struggles and joys, but as we get older we realize what real love is and give thanks to God for His intercession and

guidance to bring us together. I have witnessed how God has used Luann to help me in my roles. She has guided me so many times when I have struggled. She is not very outspoken in public, but I'm so thankful for her help. From telling me to get my head on straight in college, to putting up with my crazy ideas. God knew she was right for me, and hopefully I was for her. Let God be your guide. Build that relationship with prayer. Lots of prayers. Amen!
